



# Illinois Law Enforcement Training and Standards Board Executive Institute

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## **In-Service Training Mandates – Effective January 1, 2022**

### Annual Training (no minimum hours)

- Crisis intervention training
- Emergency medical response training and certification
- Law updates
- Officer wellness and mental health

### Every 3 years (30 hour minimum)

- Constitutional and proper use of law enforcement authority
- Cultural competency (including implicit bias and racial sensitivity)
- Civil rights
- Human rights
- Procedural justice
- Reporting child abuse and neglect

### Every 3 years

- Sexual Assault/Abuse Trauma Informed Response Training (all officers)
- Sexual Assault/Abuse Investigator Training (for those who investigate sexual assault crimes)

### Every 3 years (30 hour minimum)

- Knowledge of policies and laws regulating the use of force
- Tactics and skills, including de-escalation techniques, to prevent or reduce the need to use force or, when force must be used, to use force that is objectively reasonable, necessary, and proportional under the totality of the circumstances; and to ensure appropriate supervision and accountability.
- At least **12 hours** of hands-on, scenario-based role-playing.
- At least **6 hours** of instruction on use of force techniques, including the use of de-escalation techniques to prevent or reduce the need for force whenever safe and feasible.
- Specific training on the law concerning stops, searches, and the use of force under the Fourth Amendment to the United States Constitution.
- Specific training on officer safety techniques, including cover, concealment, and time.
- At least **6 hours** of training focused on high-risk traffic stops.

### Every 5 years

- Psychology of Domestic Violence
